Diners are invited to sit at one of three communal tables in the middle of the simply furnished dining room. Here, you can rub elbows with other locals and catch up on some SoHo gossip. Or sit at a table near the large shop front windows.

Long Island duck breast, Alaskan King salmon, and New Zealand rack of lamb are some of the highlights from the brief menu that is a showcase in modern cuisine. Under the section "Protein + 2," select any two sides to accompany the main dish—a classic American mealtime formula.

The menu makes fair use of fresh and flavorful combinations, incorporating seasonal and local meats and produce.



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
